MOVIN' ON 2024 MUSIC FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES LINEUP

<u>University Park, PA. March 29</u> - Movin' On, Penn State's student-run music festival, presents a full lineup for its annual festival at the IM Fields on April 26. The lineup includes Dayglow, Sexyy Red, and Freddie Gibbs as well as The 502s, the Student Programming Association's (SPA) sponsored act, and Battle winner, which will be announced after the event on April 9. Dayglow and Sexyy Red are co-headlining the festival. Movin' On is funded by the Penn State student activity fee with the help from the University Park Allocation Committee (UPAC).

Taking the stage first will be the winner of Battle, a competition where Penn State student performers vie for the opening slot at the festival. After the performance, The 502s, presented by SPA, will take the stage. The American indie folk band from Florida features members Ed Isola, Matthew Tonner, Sean Froehlich, Joe Capati, Nick Melashenko, and Graci Phillips. Known for their eclectic instrumentals, including banjo, piano, and horns, they have released hits like "Just A Little While" and "Magdalene." Their most recent tracks include "Perfect Portrait of Young Love" and "Something's Gonna Go Our Way." The band has also received some TikTok popularity. In 2020, The 502s <u>posted a performance of their song "Magdalene."</u> which received over 225,000 likes. In 2021, their song "Just A Little While" became <u>a viral TikTok sound</u>, resulting in about 125,000 videos using the song.

Following these acts, Freddie Gibbs will debut at Movin' On 2024. Freddie Gibbs began his rap career in 2004, self-releasing mixtapes like "Full Metal Jackit" before signing with Young Jeezy's CTE World in 2011. He gained acclaim for his collaborations with



Madlib, releasing the critically acclaimed album "Piñata" in 2014. Following the success of "Piñata," Gibbs continued to push boundaries with his solo projects, including "Shadow of a Doubt" and "You Only Live 2wice." Collaborations with The Alchemist further solidified his reputation, with projects like "Alfredo" receiving Grammy nominations and commercial success. Gibbs's signing with Warner Records in 2020 marked a new chapter in his career, leading to the release of singles like "4 Thangs" and "Gang Signs," which further demonstrated his versatility and staying power in the rap scene. His fifth, and most recent, solo album, "Soul Sold Separately," was released in 2022.

Just in time for sunset, Movin' On 2024 will continue with Sexyy Red. After bursting into the music scene in 2018 with her debut track "Ah Thousand Jugs," Sexyy Red's breakthrough came in 2021 with the release of her debut mixtape, "Ghetto Superstar." In January 2023, she collaborated with producer Tay Keith on the infectious track "Pound Town," which gained viral traction across social media platforms. Sexyy Red's momentum continued to build as she featured on the remix of NLE Choppa's "Slut Me Out" in April 2023. In May 2023, she teamed up with Nicki Minaj for "Pound Town 2," earning her first entry on the Billboard Hot 100. Sexyy Red's career reached new heights in August 2023 when she joined Drake as an opening act on his "It's All a Blur Tour," showcasing her electrifying performances to audiences worldwide. Collaborating with Drake once again, she co-performed alongside SZA on the single "Rich Baby Daddy," highlighting her versatility as an artist. Known for her straightforward lyrics and classic Southern rap style, Sexyy Red has garnered praise for her authenticity and energy. She rejects being pigeonholed into a specific genre, emphasizing her multifaceted artistry and relatable storytelling inspired by her everyday experiences.

Dayglow will cap off the night at Movin' On 2024. Founded in late 2017 as a solo project by Sloan Struble, Dayglow quickly evolved into a full-fledged band. Dayglow's breakout moment came with the release of their debut album, "Fuzzybrain," in September 2018, featuring hits like "Can I Call You Tonight?" The album's success propelled Dayglow to festivals like Austin City Limits Music Festival, solidifying their status as rising stars in the indie music scene. In 2021, Dayglow returned with their



sophomore album, "Harmony House," exploring themes of social media and the quest for fulfillment. Tracks like "Close to You" and "Something" captivated audiences with their introspective lyrics and catchy hooks. Continuing their momentum, Dayglow announced their third studio album, "People in Motion," in 2022, accompanied by singles like "Then It All Goes Away" and "Deep End." With a growing discography and a dedicated fan base, Dayglow is a vibrant blend of alternative and indie pop with an upbeat, groovy style.

Movin' On is an 18+ music festival for all Penn State students. As <u>one of the top music</u> <u>festivals in the country</u>, Movin' On takes pride in providing students with a large variety of performers to celebrate the yearly send-off of Penn State's graduating students.
